#### **Profile of Tariq Khamisa Foundation**

The Tariq Khamisa Foundation (TKF) is a San Diego nonprofit with a mission to educate and inspire children in the restorative principles of accountability, compassion, forgiveness, peacemaking, and support for safer schools and communities. TKF is recognized as a community leader in interventions that reduce student misconduct incidents and elevate school culture. TKF was formed in 1995 after 20-year-old college student, Tariq Khamisa, was killed by 14-year-old gang member, Tony Hicks, who was tried as an adult and is still serving time today. Moved by the profound loss on both sides, Tariq's and Tony's families came together in a spirit of healing and forgiveness with a vision to stop youth violence. For twenty-one years, TKF has provided innovative youth programming in schools that has reached over 500,000 local children.

Through restorative practice techniques, TKF's programs support children within a healing approach, teaching them to repair harm, build healthy relationships, and proactively encourage peace.

TKF's methods coordinate with California Common Core Standards by enhancing communication skills, teaching sound problem-solving techniques, promoting healthy decision making, and exposing youth to positive role models. TKF conducts a Safe School Model that addresses the well-being of youth through a continuum of proven-effective prevention strategies. Their core programs include Mentoring, Classroom Curriculum, Assemblies, and Youth Community Service Projects.

At TKF they strongly believe that violence is a learned behavior that can be changed. Their school-based interventions are designed to teach our children the strategies and skills needed for them to develop a positive self-esteem, to become peacemakers, and to act as responsible citizens. Through TKF-organized service projects, students are giving back to their communities in a meaningful manner. TKF incorporates service as a key intervention because it develops goodwill and a sense of community, teaches respect, and encourages positive engagement in one's environment. Under TKF's direction, children have performed hundreds of hours of service in hands-on projects such as school gardens, cleaning beaches, renovating parks and trails, sending holiday cards to the elderly, feeding the homeless, and collecting food for families in need. TKF encourages students to be active community contributors and to have a positive voice in change. Support from CSA enhances TKF's capacity in organizing school service projects.
