RTI²/SST

- •General Education Process
- •Monitor Tier I and Tier II Interventions
- Participate /consult as needed on SST/RTI team meetings

Parent Request

- Teams have 15 calendar days to respond to a written parental request for assessment
- Teams respond with a written referral and assessment plan/PWN or Prior Written Notice (PWN)

Referral

- •A proposed assessment plan is developed within 15 calendar days of the written referral
- •When a referral is developed within 15 days of end of the regular school year, the assessment plan must be developed the subsequent school year and not exceed the 15 day timeline from the date of the initial referral, excluding days between school terms (see IEP development timeline below)

Assessment Plan

- · Assess in all areas of suspected disability
- Parents/Guardians have 15 days to review, provide written consent and return the assessment plan

IEP Developmer

- •An IEP is developed within 60 calendar days from the date of receipt of the parent/guardian's written consent to the assessment plan
- •If consent is received 30 calendar days or less prior to the end of a regular school year, the assessment and IEP meeting shall be held within 30 calendar days of the subsequent school year.

EP Meeting Notification

- Parents/guardians must be notified of the proposed IEP team meeting "early enough to ensure an opportunity to attend" the meeting.
- •Generally, parents/guardians should be invited 10 14 calendar days prior to the proposed date

Triennial IFD

- A reassessment of the student shall be conducted at least once every three years
- Date determined by initial or last triennial
- Consent for Assessment does not change due date

IFP Meeting

- Parent can provide full written consent, partial consent, non-consent or can take the IEP home to review
- Review period is generally 3 5 days.
- •Lock IEP in electronic system as soon as possible.
- Begin implementation of consented to IEP (or parts) as soon as possible.

IEP Meeting Notification

- Parents/guardians must be notified of the proposed IEP team meeting "early enough to ensure an opportunity to attend" the meeting.
- •Generally more than one week, or at least 10 calendar days.

Annual IFP

 To be held no later than one calendar year from the previous annual or interim IEP meeting date

IED Mooting

- Parent can provide full written consent, partial consent, non-consent or can take the plan home to review
- •Review period is generally 3 5 days
- Lock IEP in electronic system as soon as possible.
- •Begin Implementation of consented to IEP (or parts) as soon as possible

Interim Placement

- •When a student transfers into SDUSD from another district, he/she is immediately provided an Interim Pacement IEP that includes services comparable to those described in the previously approved IEP in consultation with the parents
- Within a 30-days of enrollment an Interim Review IEP team meeting must be held and a new (annual) IEP must be developed



Parent/Guardian has the right to request to have an IEP meeting anytime. The case manager has 30 calendar days to hold the requested IEP meeting.
