Reference: Site Operations Circular No. 1044, dated June 30, 2005

Action Requested: Plan for administration of California Standards Tests (CSTs), CAT/6 Survey, California Alternate Performance Assessment (CAPA), and Aprenda 3 as outlined and complete and return the attached order forms as appropriate.

Brief Explanation:

Senate Bill (SB) 376, approved in October 1997, established the Standardized Testing and Reporting (STAR) Program. This bill authorized the assessment of students in California for which there is a language-appropriate test. The STAR program consists of the California Standards Tests (CSTs), the *California Achievement Test, Sixth Edition Survey*, or CAT/6 Survey, the *Aprenda, Third Edition* or *Aprenda 3*, and the California Alternate Performance Assessment (CAPA). The CSTs are administered to all students in Grades 2-11. The CAT/6 Survey was developed by CTB/McGraw-Hill and is to be administered to all students in Grades 3 and 7 except as discussed below. The California Alternate Performance Assessment (CAPA) serves as the alternate assessment to the CSTs and CAT/6 for students in Grades 2-11 with moderate to severe disabilities who meet specific criteria. The *Aprenda/3*, developed by Harcourt Assessment, is to be administered to all Spanish-speaking English Learners in accordance with regulations established in SB 376.

This circular contains information related to testing information and/or requirements for:

- the California Standards Tests (CSTs) in language, mathematics, science, and history/social science,
- the CAT/6 Survey,
- the California Alternate Performance Assessment (CAPA),
- the *Aprenda 3*,
- testing requirements and exemptions/exceptions for:
 - Special Education/504 Plan students,
 - English Learners and Spanish-speaking English Learners (**Attachment A must be completed and returned by October 7, 2005, even if your school has no Spanish-speaking English Learners**),

- parent/guardian requests to opt students out of testing (see Attachment B),
- elective testing of students in Grade 1 (Attachment C to be completed and returned. NOTE: this is a cost item to your school),
- ordering of CAT/6 Teacher Guides and additional CAT/6 Survey practice tests (Attachment D to be completed and returned. NOTE: this is a cost item to your school. Please note that we do NOT guarantee delivery prior to the STAR testing window if materials are ordered AFTER FEBRUARY 1, 2006), and
- ordering of CSTs, CAT/6 Survey, and Aprenda 3 tests for visually impaired students (Attachment E to be completed and returned).

Please read the following carefully.

STAR California Standards Testing:

All students in Grades 2-11, including English Learners (ELs), must be tested on all appropriate language arts, mathematics, history-social science, and science CSTs and students in Grades 3 and 7, including ELs, must be tested on all appropriate reading/language, mathematics, and spelling subtests of the CAT/6 Survey. All CSTs are "stand-alone," which means that these tests include only items written specifically for the California Standards and no norm-referenced CAT/6 Survey items will be used to produce the standards-based CST scores.

Required Testing:

- CSTs: All students, including English Learners, in Grades 2 through 11 must be tested with the appropriate CSTs unless they fall within the exceptions described below.
- CAT/6 Survey: All students, including English Learners, in Grades 3 and 7 must be tested with the CAT/6 Survey unless they fall within the exceptions described below.
- CAPA: Special Education students with moderate to severe disabilities who meet specific criteria and have been identified by the student's IEP team to be eligible for assessment with CAPA.
- Aprenda 3: All Spanish-speaking English Learner students in Grades 2 through 11 who have been enrolled in a California public school less than 12 months or are enrolled in a Bilingual Program must be tested unless they fall within the exceptions described below.

Exceptions/Opt Outs

- Special Education: Federal law (IDEA '97) requires students with exceptional needs to participate in state assessments. All students, including those with disabilities, must participate in the state STAR testing. The majority of special education students take the STAR tests with the accommodations that the student has regularly used during instruction and classroom assessments as delineated in the student's IEP or 504 Plan (ISP). The CAPA is to be administered to selected students with moderate to severe disabilities whose IEP specifically allows for testing with an alternate assessment. No other alternate assessments to STAR are allowed.

- Students with an Individual Services Plan/ISP (504 Plan): Students with an ISP are required to participate in state assessments.
- Students whose IEP/ISP Plan requires accommodations (e.g., extended time) be provided are to be tested with the required accommodations.
 - > Students served by the Program for Visually Impaired and students whose IEP/ISP requires large print or Braille test materials will be provided with the appropriate CST and/or CAT/6 Survey and/or *Appendix 3* materials. **It is the responsibility of each school site to assess the need for such materials and to complete and return Attachment E by October 7, 2005.**
- English Learner (EL) Students: All EL students are required to take the CAT/6 Survey and appropriate CSTs. In addition, many Spanish-speaking EL students must also be tested with *Appendix 3* as described below.
 - All Spanish-speaking EL students who have been enrolled in a California school for less than 12 months **must also be tested** with *Appendix 3* (even if they have never received instruction in Spanish). The Testing Unit will provide each school a roster of Spanish-speaking EL students who have been enrolled in the district for less than 12 months in late September. Schools may use this roster as a “starting point” to determine, through student records and interviews, whether or not a student meets the criteria of less than 12 months in a California school.

Enter on Attachment A the number (by grade) of Spanish-speaking EL students at your school who have been enrolled in a California school for less than 12 months (cum folders may need to be reviewed and/or interviews conducted to determine these numbers).

Harcourt Assessment, the publisher of *Appendix 3*, imposes an *Excessive Materials Charge* of approximately \$6.00 per test for any order for tests that is "excessive." "Excessive" is defined to be the difference between the sum of the number of student tests scored and 90 percent of the tests ordered. If you order *Appendix 3* materials, a site budget number is required. ANY EXCESS MATERIALS ORDERED WILL BE CHARGED TO YOUR SITE.

Enter a “0” if your site has no Spanish-speaking ELs at a particular grade level who have been enrolled in a California school for less than 12 months.

- All Spanish-speaking EL students who have been enrolled in a California school for 12 months or more AND are enrolled in a Bilingual Program (formerly Spanish Bilingual/Alternate Language Program) **must be tested** with *Appendix 3*. Enrollment in a Bilingual Program means that the student’s parent/guardian has signed a waiver for student placement in the Bilingual Program at your site.

Enter on Attachment A the number (by grade) of Spanish-speaking EL students in a Bilingual Program at your site who have been enrolled in a California school for 12 months or more.

Enter a “0” if your site has no Spanish-speaking ELs in a particular grade level who have been enrolled 12 months or more AND participate in a Bilingual Program.

To complete Attachment A:

- > **For each grade level, add the totals in each column and place the total in the “Total Booklets Needed” column.**

(Attachment A must be completed and returned by October 7, 2005, even if your school has no Spanish-speaking English Learners. You do NOT need to include a site budget number if you are not ordering any *Aprenda 3* materials.)

- All other Spanish-speaking EL students are not required to be tested with *Aprenda 3*.
 - > Students served by the Program for Visually Impaired and students whose IEP/ISP requires large print or Braille test materials will be provided with the appropriate *Aprenda 3* materials. **It is the responsibility of each school site to assess the need for such materials and to complete and return Attachment E by October 7, 2005.**
- Students in Other Special Programs: Students enrolled in continuation schools, independent study, hospital instruction, home schooling, and/or community day school must be tested by a credentialed staff member unless opted out of testing by parent/guardian request described below.
- Students Opted Out of Testing by Parent/Guardian Request: A parent or guardian may submit to the school a written request (Attachment B) to excuse his/her child from any or all parts of CSTs, CAT/6 Survey, CAPA, *Aprenda 3*, or other tests coordinated at the district level. **Such requests must be initiated by the parent or guardian and no school official shall solicit such a written request on behalf of any child. Attachment B must be completed by the parent/guardian. Each test that is NOT to be administered to a student must be initialed. A signature is also required.**

The original form should be kept on file at the site and appropriate teachers notified. A copy of the form should be given to the parent/guardian. (Note: Attachment B is to be used only in the event of a parent/guardian request. It is not to be mailed to all parents.)

Principals will be asked to certify the number of students “opted out of testing by parent(s)” on CSTs, CAT/6 Survey, CAPA, and *Aprenda 3* on the Certification Form sent to schools with their testing materials.

Elective/Discretionary Testing (CAT/6 Survey and/or *Aprenda 3*):

- Elective Testing: Testing of students enrolled in Grade 1 is not required for any school. However, schools may elect to test students in this grade. **Costs for elective testing (including materials, scanning, scoring, and reporting) are the school’s responsibility.** The Testing Unit will order elective testing materials along with its districtwide order.

Schools wishing to order materials for elective testing of students in Grade 1 must complete and return Attachment C by October 7, 2005. The following are included in the scoring/scanning/reporting package costs listed on the attachment.

- CAT/6 Survey: Includes basic scanning/scoring charges and the four reports listed below.
 - > *Class Record Sheet*
 - > *Cal-Stik Label*
 - > *Individual Profile Report*
 - > *Home Report*
- *Aprenda 3*: Includes basic scanning/scoring charges and the five reports listed below.
 - > *Student Report with Clusters (2 copies in English)*
 - > *Group Report with Clusters (2 copies in English)*
 - > *Student Record Label (1 copy)*

- > *Master List of Test Results (1 copy)*
- > *Master List Summary (1 copy)*

Practice Test Materials and CAT/6 Teacher Guides:

Under the STAR Program, practice materials for CAT/6 Survey are only provided for students in Grade 3. Practice materials for *Aprenda 3* are provided for all grade levels tested.

- CAT/6 Survey: Schools are responsible for ordering and funding practice materials at Grade 7. Schools may use the practice materials on a **non-consumable** basis and half-sheet answer forms and a blackline answer form master are available through the Testing Unit.

Schools wishing to order CAT/6 Teacher Guides and/or CAT/6 Survey practice materials must complete Attachment D. Please note that we do NOT guarantee delivery prior to the STAR testing window if materials are ordered AFTER FEBRUARY 1, 2006. A site budget number is required.

California Standards Test Materials

California Standards tests in mathematics at Grades 8, 9, 10, and 11 and science at Grades 9, 10, and 11 are “content-specific” and printed in separate booklets. Students who are enrolled at the time of the STAR testing interval in one of the courses assessed by the corresponding California Standards test will take the appropriate California Standards test in mathematics and science. If a student completed one of the courses during the 2005 summer school and is not enrolled at the time of the STAR testing interval in one of the courses assessed by the corresponding California Standards test, he/she must take the appropriate California Standards test for the course they completed in 2005 summer school. California Standards tests in mathematics and science will be ordered for schools based on course enrollments on the mainframe as of **October 7, 2005**.


All students in Grades 9-11 who will complete Algebra II or a higher mathematics course before the spring 2006 testing window are required to take the ***High School Mathematics (HSM) Standards Test***. Students in Grades 8 and 9 who are not enrolled in Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II and who will not have completed Algebra II by the beginning of the spring 2006 testing window are required to take the ***General Mathematics Standards Test***. Please refer to Attachment F to determine which California Mathematics Standards Test should be administered to students in the district courses listed. It is highly recommended that schools on a 4X4 schedule and/or any schools offering atypical mathematics courses call the Testing Unit to discuss appropriate CST testing.

All students in Grades 9-11 who will complete Biology 1, 2, Biology 1, 2 Honors, or Biology 1, 2 AP during the 2005-2006 school year (or completed in the 2005 summer school) are required to take the ***California Biology Standards Test***. All students in Grades 9-11 who will complete Chemistry 1-2, Chemistry 1-2 Honors, or Chemistry 1-2 AP during the 2005-2006 school year (or completed in the 2005 summer school) are required to take the ***California Chemistry Standards Test***. All students in Grades 9-11 who will complete Physics 1, 2, Physics 1, 2 Honors, Physics B 1, 2 AP, or Physics C 1, 2 AP during the 2005-2006 school year (or completed in the 2005 summer school) are required to take the ***California Physics Standards Test***. Please refer to Attachment G to determine which California Science Standards Test should be administered to students in the district courses listed. It is highly recommended that schools on a 4X4 schedule and/or any schools offering atypical mathematics courses call the Testing Unit to discuss appropriate CST testing.
