Athletes For Education Foundation (AFE) and San Diego City Schools present Camp Leon; the 8th annual activity based life skills training camp for middle school boys and girls.

Camp Leon, named after former NFL player Leon White, will provide selected students with the opportunity to interact with professional, college, and high school athletes, while participating in a variety of physical fitness, sports and team-building activities. The goal of the camp is to motivate students to succeed in school, to strengthen self-esteem, to inspire them to follow their dreams and reward student achievement. Criteria for the selection of participants might include improvement in reading level, improved attendance, increased motivation and attitude toward academics and improved citizenship.

The camp is scheduled for Saturday and Sunday, June 3-4, 2006, on the San Diego High School campus. Saturday will feature one session, 11:00 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. Sunday will include one afternoon session from 12p.m. – 5:30 p.m. Participating schools will be assigned a specific camp date and session their student may attend along with the appropriate number of permission slips.

There is no registration fee or cost to participating students. We encourage both boys and girls to attend.

Each camper will receive lunch/snacks, a personally autographed T-shirt, and goodie bag. The Camp Leon staff will provide supervision. School District personnel will be not responsible for the supervision of children attending this event.

Schools that submit a response form will be contacted by a Camp Leon staff member to schedule a site visit. Mentor athletes such as Leon White of the Bengals and Rams, Karl Wilson of the Buffalo Bills, Darren Carrington of the Chargers, Tonie Campbell 1980-84 Olympic Gold Medalist, Lonny Mitchell of the Baltimore Ravens, JR Tolver of the Miami Dolphins and Akbar Gbaja-Biamila of the Oakland Raiders will be attending the camp.

If you are interested in including your site in this event, please complete and submit the attached response form to Bruce Ward, Athletics Office, no later than March 31, 2006. It is important that you respond ASAP so AFE is able to begin their tracking and evaluation process for their grant to run Camp Leon, a physical activity program. The contact person listed on the following page must be willing to coordinate your school's participation in Camp Leon.

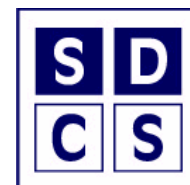

Athletes for Education Foundation (AFE) and San Diego City Schools present **Camp Leon (CL)**, the 8th annual activity based life skills camp for middle school boys and girls. The camp is designed to reward 7th & 8th graders for achieving academic and citizenship objectives set by their teachers; **Camp Leon** will take place June 3 & 4, 2006, at San Diego High School.



Current and retired NFL & MLB players and other athletes from sports such as Capoeira, a form of Brazilian Martial Arts, and members of the U.S. Olympic teams are volunteering their time to serve as role models for CL '06 participants. Students will learn about the importance of health and fitness and participate in activities designed to teach coordination, teamwork, discipline, and build self-confidence. Our goal is to motivate children to succeed in school, strengthen their self-esteem and inspire them to follow their dreams. This year we anticipate that some 300 7th & 8th grade students from SDCS will take part in CL '06.



Camp Leon's Hosts

Athletes for Education Foundation (AFE) is a nonprofit organization of current and former professional athletes, entertainers, business and community leaders who serve as role models for youth. AFE hosts special events and fundraisers to benefit community youth programs while also providing mentorship programs for at-risk youth throughout San Diego. AFE encourages kids to: *Be creative, Build Bridges Instead of Walls, and Dare to Dream!* Our objective and motto is "**Helping Our Youth Help Themselves.**"

Leon White (*Host of Camp Leon*) is a San Diego native who graduated from Helix High and attended Brigham Young University, where he was an All-Conference linebacker. Leon was selected as the most valuable player in BYU's 1984 Holiday Bowl victory over the University of Michigan, and was inducted into the Holiday Bowl Hall of Fame in 2001. In 1986 the Cincinnati Bengals drafted Leon, thus beginning his successful eight-year career in the National Football League. One of the highlights of his NFL career included playing in the starting lineup of the 1989 Super Bowl. Leon decided to retire from professional football in order to spend more time with his family and be more involved in the community. In addition to his many volunteer activities, Leon works with the San Diego High School Varsity Football team as the defensive coordinator. In 1999, he created **Camp Leon** in partnership with Athletes for Education Foundation (AFE) and San Diego City Schools. The goal was, and continues to be, to provide mentorship and encouragement for at-risk youth through both, interaction with role models and participation in physical activities.
